AFA 5935	Selected Topics in Africana Studies: Issues in Africana Studies	3	Variable topics course focusing on the history, culture, and lived experiences of Africans, African American, and/or other peoples of African descent worldwide. Rpt. Up to 12 hours as topics vary.
AFA 6108	Social Construction of Race and Racism	3	Examinations of the social construction of race, racism, racial identities and cross-racial relationships in the US from the colonial period to present.
AFA 6932	Selected Topics in Africana Studies: Black Construction of the Americas	3	This course will examine the historical and geographical distribution of Africans in the diaspora and the political and economic roles they have played in the development of the Western world, with a focus on America. The course takes an interdisciplinary approach. The course is not restricted to majors and is not repeatable for credit.
AFA 6932	Selected Topics in Africana Studies: Women of Africa and Diaspora	3	Variable topics course focusing on the history, culture, and lived experiences of African, African-American, and/or other peoples of African descent worldwide.
PAD 6336	Community Development Programs and Strategies	3	Discusses community development principles and practices in historical and contemporary perspectives, federal, state and local initiatives, physical, social and economic approaches to community development.
